PHILADELPHIA, Penn. May 21.—The will of Col. John McKee, the colored millionaire, who died April 6, leaving the great bulk of his estate for the founding of a college under the management of the Catholic Church, and cutting off his daughter, grandson, and other relatives with meagre annuities, was admitted to probate by Register Singer to-day.

In some way a compromise has been effected, and the caveat which had been filed by James Gay Gordon and T. J. Hinton on behalf of Abbie C. P. Syphx. daughter, and H. McKee Hinton, grandson, was to-day withdrawn. The withdrawal of the caveat was a great surprise, as it was expected that the relatives would wage a bitter contest to break the will.
