## METATE OF JOHN HOKKE, DECEASED

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE HASTER, ADOPTED BY THE HOSDFABLE BOBERT V. BOLGER, AUDITING JUDGE, IN HIS ADJUDICATION DATED SEPTEMBER 25, 1952 SUBSEQUENTLY APPROVED BY THE COURT SE BANC AND BY THE SUPREME COURT OF PERHSYLVANIA

## Recommendations

- 1. It is recommended that the fund presently before the Court and available for distribution, both principal and accumulated income, be awarded to be retained by the present Trustee in further trust, to be known henceforth as the \*John McKee Scholarship Pund\*.
- 2. It is recommended that future not income from the fund be used to supply scholarship aid to poor colored and white orphan (fatherless) boys, in equal numbers as nearly as possible, preference being given to those born in Philadelphia and to those who seek nevel education and training.
- J. It is recommended that a committee be appointed by the Court, to be known as the "John McKee Scholarship Committee", its functions being to receive applications for scholarship aid, the screening and grading of applicants on the besis of scholastic and other necessary qualifications, deciding how many scholarships should be avarded periodically based on the smount of income available for the purpose, deciding by competitive examination or otherwise which applicants should receive scholarship aid, the amount and kind of such aid, the institutions they should attend, and such other matters as may be incident to a proper administration of the fund.

- 4. It is recommended that the Beholarship Committee be composed of not less than five and not more than ten members; that at least a majority of the members be chosen by virtue of the public offices they occupy rather than because of personal qualifications; that the Committee be inter-racial at all times. having a fair representation of both colored and white members; that the Trustee of the John McKee Scholarship Fund (or his nominee if he should not care to serve) be a member of the Committee at all times; that the President Judge or an Associate Judge of the Orphens! Court of Philadelphia be a member of the Committee at all times; and that the other members of the Committee be persons who are well known in the field of higher education and who are qualified by experience and training to pass upon applications for scholarship aid, perticularly with regard to navel education and training.
- 5. It is further recommended that the eforesaid Scholarship Committee, when appointed, he permitted to promulgate its own rules and regulations, with authority to amend and change them from time to time as circumstances werrant, and that such rules and regulations, or any amendments thereto, he submitted to the Court for its approval before they are finally adopted. Also, it is recommended that the Committee be required to make periodic reports to the Court concerning the administration of the fund.

6. It is further recommended that all funds, both principal and income, be at all times kept in the possession or under the control of the Trustee, and that he be authorized to disburse net income only upon directions from the Scholarship Committee acting under its power to appoint for scholarship purposes.
