M'KEE SECURITIES WORTHLESS

Appraisers Discover that Eccentric Colored Man Left Only \$60,594 in Personal Property

The appraisers recently appointed to make an inventory of the personal estates of Colonel John McKee, the colored millionaire land owner, filed their report with Deputy Register of Wills Irvin to-day.

His personal estate is valued at \$60,594.29

Many of the securities left as deposits in savings funds and safe deposit companies proved worthless. Of the entire amount made in returns today \$53,000 was found deposited in several savings funds and national banks.

The fact that the inventory discovered many valueless securities, it is said, does not in any way decrease the giant fortune left by the eccentric old colored man. The millions he left for the establishment of a school for orphan children is therefore not affected by the returns made to-day by the appraisers, who are William J. Powers and Thomas Baylen.
